PRINTED ABSTRACT ➤ Abstract is clear, concise, correct, & well written		
INTRODUCTION ➤ Provides adequate context & background ➤ Explains why this work is important ("big picture")		
DESIGN & METHODS ➤ Appropriate methods used for this study ➤ Experimental design & stats are sound & reasonable		
RESULTS & INTERPRETATION ➤ Data analysis appropriate & correct ➤ Interpretation is based on the results, & provides an interesting, compelling story		
ORIGINALITY & CONTRIBUTION TO SCIENTIFIC DISCIPLINE ➤ Study is original & creative ➤ Important contribution to coastal science ➤ Ties in with related studies previously done		

VISUAL PRESENTATION

ORGANIZATION ➤ Information is in logical sequence ➤ Presentation/poster is well-organized & easy to follow		
DESIGN OF SLIDES/POSTER ➤ Text size is large enough to read ➤ Layout, color, & design are visually engaging ➤ Figures and tables are clear and easy to understand		

VERBAL COMMUNICATION

VERBAL SKILLS ➤ Speaks in a clear, professional tone ➤ Enthusiastic & interacts with audience ➤ Stays within allotted time (oral presentation only)		
UNDERSTANDING OF SUBJECT ➤ Displays clear knowledge & understanding of topic ➤ Answers audience questions clearly & effectively
